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INTRODUCTION

A figurehead for many years in British light railway development, Lieutenant-Colonel Holman Fred Stephens had been a student at University College, London, and afterwards worked in the Metropolitan Railway locomotive and carriage workshops in Neasden.

He began his light railway career in 1890 as resident engineer of the Cranbrook & Paddock Wood Railway, also known as the Paddock Wood & Hawkhurst, and later the Hawkhurst branch of the Southern Railway. Between 1897 and 1902, he was engineer of the Sheppey Light Railway, which was operated by the SE&CR.

Stephens rebuilt the East Cornwall Railway as the Bere Alston & Calstock branch of the Plymouth, Devonport & South Western Junction Railway in 1904; and in 1907 rebuilt the derelict Potteries, Shrewsbury & North Wales Railway into the Shropshire & Montgomeryshire Light Railway. In 1909 he converted the Burry Port & Gwendraeth Valley Railway, later part of the GWR, into a passenger line.

He built the Rother Valley - later renamed the Kent & East Sussex - Railway; the East Kent Railways; the Weston, Clevedon & Portishead Railway; the North Devon & Cornwall Junction Railway; the Edge Hill Light Railway; and the Hundred of Manhood & Selsey Tramway, later renamed the West Sussex Railway. He was also involved with several narrow gauge railways: the Festiniog, Welsh Highland, Rye & Camber, Ashover and Snailbeach District railways.

As chairman of the Association of Minor Railways, he held posts with 11 of the 23 railway companies in the Association. On his death, at Dover on 23 October 1931, aged 66, he was chairman of the S&MR, and managing director of the K&ESR, WSR, ND&CJR, and the S&MR.

He was also locomotive superintendent of the K&ESR, WSR, EKR, WC&PR, and the S&MR; and engineer to the K&ESR, WSR, ND&CJR, EKR, WC&PR, the Weston Point Light Railway and the S&MR. In addition he held similar posts on several narrow gauge railways.

The purpose of this guide is to provide, for the many enthusiasts of the Colonel's railways, a catalogue and brief review of references in books, magazines, on video and on film, of the standard gauge light railways with which Colonel Stephens was involved, and also to supply a list of models available for the railway modelling enthusiast.

Most references have a * rating, out of five, to indicate value. This is a purely personal assessment based on a combination of content, rarity, photographs, drawings, accuracy and so on. It is not a comment on the quality of the item.

Although most book and magazine references are out of print, they may be available second-hand, or loaned from local libraries, who can supply to order books and photocopies of magazine articles for a small fee.
